ABSTRACT

According to the World Health Organization, in the general population, 20.0% of cases of disease among women are associated with reproductive disorders. Therefore, strengthening reproductive health and protecting the health of pregnant women should be one of the priority areas of activity of health authorities and institutions. However, to date, systematic ideas about the needs of pregnant women for the necessary types of treatment and diagnostic services and medical and social assistance to women during pregnancy and childbirth have not yet been formed.
